Warly Remegio, DNP, RN, NPD-BC, NEA-BC, FNYAM, is the System Vice President of Nursing Education and Professional Development across the entire Hartford HealthCare System. In this role, he leads the development and advancement of a system focus program for education and nursing professional development based upon patient & family-centered care approaches that achieve quality outcomes. He develops and implements strategies to ensure we have seamless integration and standardization of various nursing education, professional development, and practice initiatives to improve nursing, patient care, and other organizational outcomes.

Before his appointment at Hartford HealthCare, Dr. Remegio was the Program Director of Nursing Professional Development at New York-Presbyterian Hospital in New York City. In this role, he was primarily responsible for overseeing all the education and nursing professional development programs at LMH Campus. As an integral member of the nursing executive team, he always amplified the value of professional development and structural empowerment toward advancing nursing practice and improving patient care outcomes by fostering a culture of mentorship, professional excellence, and a healthy and supportive work environment. In his career, he serves numerous education and leadership roles, as a critical care education specialist, program manager and interim director of the Center for Professional Practice Excellence at Holy Name, Medical Center (2012-2015), Adjunct Assistant Professor at Long Island University (2009-2014), and as Assistant Director of Nursing in Medicine and Rehabilitation at Bellevue Hospital Center (2009-2014). He continuously contributes to advancing nursing through research and publications focusing on clinical nurses' psychological empowerment, professional quality of life, work engagement, and transformational leadership. He presented locally, nationally, and internationally.

Dr. Remegio is also the Vice President of the Philippine Nurses Association of America Eastern Region and the immediate past President of PNA-New York. He founded the PNANY Scholarship Program, the **ASPIRE** Scholarship fund, the PNANY Ambassador, and the Sagip-Kababayan Emergency Fund for the victims of calamities in the Philippines. At the national level, he chairs the 43rd PNAA National Convention and co-chairs the Anti-Racism in Nursing Taskforce and the PNAA Formal Nurse Mentorship Program. Furthermore, Dr. Remegio also served as a member of the 2022 Scope and Standard Association of Nursing Professional Development Scope and Standards. In 2015, Dr. Remegio was chosen by Nurse.com as a Regional Finalist of the "Give Excellence Meaning" (GEM) Award on Education and Mentorship for the New Jersey/ New York Metro Area due to his exemplary achievements that impact patient, nursing, and organizational outcomes. Most recently, due to his commendable leadership in the healthcare community, he was awarded Outstanding Leadership (2022) by the Philippine Nurses Association of America. He was selected as a Fellow of the Young Professional Voices of the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (2020) and a Fellow of the New York Academy of Medicine (2021).

Dr. Remegio completed his Doctor of Nursing Practice at Case Western Reserve University-Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing and is finishing his post-doctoral fellowship at the Marian Shaughnessy Nursing Leadership Academy.
